<b>Routed</b>	<p><b>NATIVE</b> The incorporation of species and materials adapted or suited to the area, <i>e.g. reflect the local area in gardens and landscaping</i></p>	<p><b>BELONGING</b> Identification between people and place expressed through friendship, culture and local traditions, <i>e.g. hold community events in a public building or place</i></p>	<p><b>STEWARDSHIP</b> Secure and diverse forms of tenancy and community management of assets, <i>e.g. enable the community to create housing and services suited to their needs</i></p>	<p><b>PLACE-MAKING</b> Delightful places that people love and want to be in, <i>e.g. craft buildings that consider local styles, materials, climate and context and give a distinct local character</i></p>	<b>Routed</b>
<b>Connected</b>	<p><b>ECOSYSTEMS</b> Local ecosystems remain whole by retaining and creating links. <i>e.g. maintain wildlife corridors and natural water courses</i></p>	<p><b>SOCIAL EXCHANGE</b> A network of social and community organisations that promote connections between people, <i>e.g. support clubs, sports teams, cafés, and volunteer opportunities</i></p>	<p><b>INTEGRATED</b> <i>Accessible capital and local goods as well as supported commercial hubs and local trading, e.g. facilitate local markets and supply chains</i></p>	<p><b>INTERCONNECTED</b> Neighbourhoods with linked walkable streets allowing access to public spaces and transportation, <i>e.g. develop logical routes where all daily needs are within a five-minute walk</i></p>	<b>Connected</b>
<b>Balanced</b>	<p><b>BIODIVERSE HABITAT</b> A sustainable relationship between man, animals and plants, <i>e.g. produce diverse crops around a town for food security</i></p>	<p><b>MIXED</b> An inclusive, diverse and mixed population that is tolerant and respectful, <i>e.g. provide homes that the community can afford</i></p>	<p><b>DIVERSE</b> A mixed local economy and a mixed profile of investment, <i>e.g. make local goods available and affordable</i></p>	<p><b>PROPORTIONAL</b> Places with beautiful and well-scaled architecture and a mix of building types, <i>e.g. design a high street with decorated shop fronts</i></p>	<b>Balanced</b>
<b>Resilient</b>	<p><b>REGENERATIVE</b> The ability for the natural environment to respond and adapt to changes in climate and human activity, <i>e.g. include natural drainage systems to reduce the risk of flooding</i></p>	<p><b>LOCAL GOVERNANCE</b> Local planning and organising frameworks and life-long education opportunities, <i>e.g. promote education and skills training opportunities for all ages</i></p>	<p><b>ADAPTABLE</b> A flexible economic framework with a broad range of economic activities at different scales, <i>e.g. build new housing in phases, using a sustainable growth model</i></p>	<p><b>DURABLE</b> Building types, spaces and uses that are suited for the region that can adapt and change over time, <i>e.g. plan houses that could become flats, businesses or small shops</i></p>	<b>Resilient</b>
<b>Prudent</b>	<p><b>CONSERVATION</b> The protection, management and enhancement of natural resources, <i>e.g. use sustainably harvested timber and other natural materials</i></p>	<p><b>ACCESS TO SERVICES</b> Safe community facilities and amenities for people, <i>e.g. maintain a centrally located library and health and job centres</i></p>	<p><b>REINVESTMENT</b> Frugal financial planning with a vision of quality giving long-term returns. <i>e.g. incorporate timely maintenance and community reinvestment schemes</i></p>	<p><b>PRESERVATION</b> A priority to refurbish and renovate with recycled and lasting materials and renewable resources, <i>e.g. use passive cooling and heating and employ renewable energy sources</i></p>	<b>Prudent</b>
